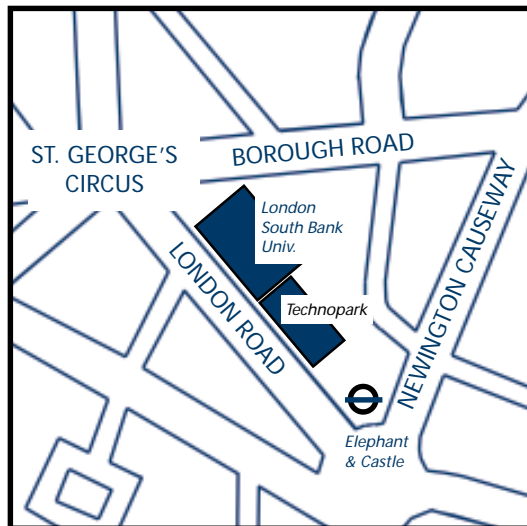


Group meetings are conveniently held at London South Bank University, Technopark, London Road, London SE1.

All too often an accident just produces a data set. In this presentation, Adrian Watson will look at how to fully evaluate accidents and gain added-value for your company.

**18th October  
Managing Occupational Road Risk - David Wallington**

BT has the largest commercial fleet in Europe with 44,000 vehicles on Britain's roads every day. BT Group Safety Adviser David Wallington will describe the policies, assessment techniques, data analysis and training necessary to ensure an effective approach to this important risk management area

**15th November

HSE officer Shelley Atkinson-Frost will examine occupational health in the construction sector, looking at the industry's health record, current OH issues, HSE and industry initiatives, and the way forward.
