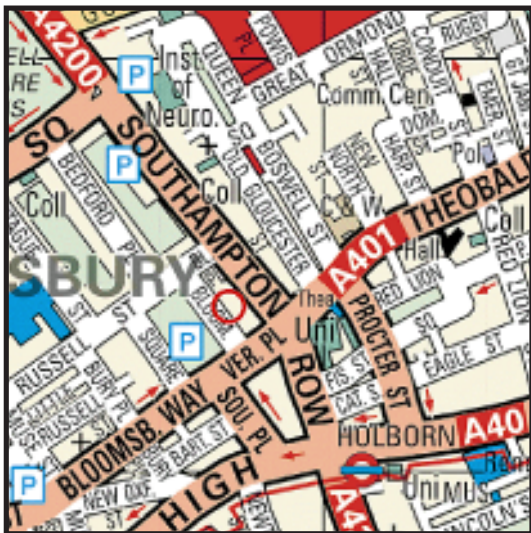


Group meetings are held at the central London offices of Sport England, 3rd Floor, Victoria House, Bloomsbury Square, London WC1B 4SE
